Severe thunderstorms, straight-line winds, and the inland remnants of Gulf tropical systems move through the region throughout the summer, sending trees and heavy limbs onto homes, vehicles, fences, and power lines. Dead, leaning, or previously storm-damaged trees carry the greatest risk, and the company says the most expensive damage it sees each year is almost always preventable.

"By the time a tree comes down in a storm, the warning signs have usually been there for months," said Robbie Plyler, owner of Plyler's Tree Service. "A leaning trunk, a big dead limb hanging over the roof, cracks at the base — those are the trees we'd rather take care of on a calm afternoon than at two in the morning in the rain. A free assessment costs nothing, and it's a lot cheaper than a new roof."

Plyler's recommends that property owners walk their land before the next system and look for a

few common red flags: dead or hanging branches, especially those overhanging structures; trunks that have begun to lean or that show vertical cracks; soil heaving or exposed roots at the base; and trees that have already lost limbs in past storms. Any of these warrants a professional look, the company says, and it offers free on-site evaluations with honest, written pricing before any work begins.

The company's services include professional tree removal, precision trimming and pruning, stump grinding below grade, and emergency storm-damage cleanup. Crews arrive equipped with bucket trucks, rigging, chippers, and safety gear to handle everything from routine maintenance to complex removals near structures
