The [National Eating Disorders Association](#) reports that people with ARFID eat less food, or less variety of it, and its reasons may vary. Some may feel almost no appetite at all, or they have reactions to certain tastes, smells, and textures. Others may be afraid of choking, throwing up, or getting sick from a certain food.

Children tend to be picky eaters, so ARFID is also often thought of as a childhood condition. But adults struggle with ARFID, too. In fact, [recent studies](#) show that adults can actually develop it later in life. Unfortunately, because many medical providers don't think to screen adults for ARFID, countless people end up suffering in silence for years.
