

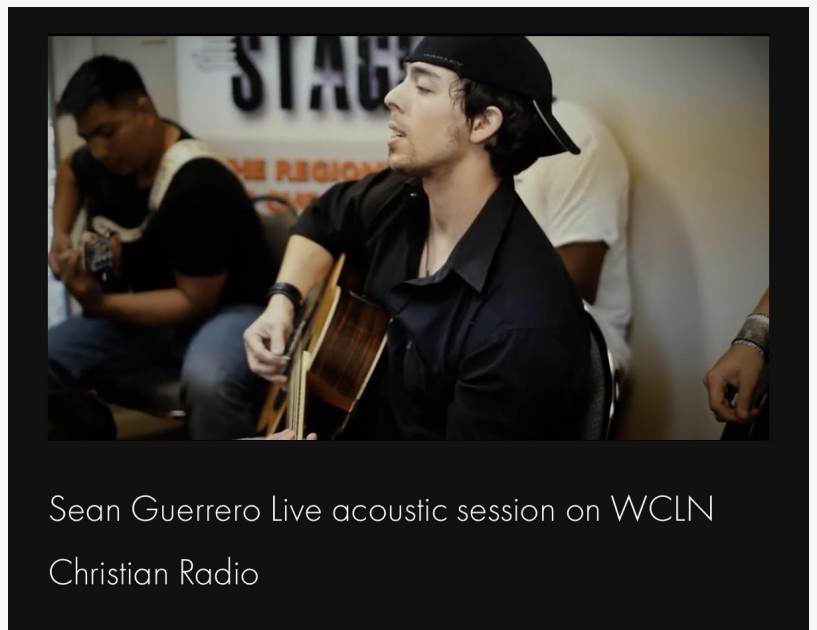
Award-Winning Singer-Songwriter Sean Guerrero Confronts Addiction, PTSD and Hopelessness With New Single 'Addiction'

Cinematic Rock Artist Draws on Seven Years in High-Threat Environments Overseas Shares a Message of Faith and Renewed Purpose for Those Fighting Hidden Battles

WILMINGTON, NC, UNITED STATES, August 24, 2026 /EINPresswire.com/ -- Award-winning singer-songwriter and recording artist Sean Guerrero releases "Addiction" on Sept. 8, 2026, a cinematic rock single addressing addiction, trauma, PTSD, depression, anxiety and hidden struggles affecting individuals and families. "Holding On" captures a sample of Guerrero's performance https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=BtpaM5t_kFc&authuser=1 Built around Guerrero's story-driven rock sound, "Addiction" explores how unresolved pain can lead toward destructive ways of coping, including substance misuse, lust, shame and isolation, while pointing listeners toward hope and renewed purpose.

"Addiction" is about bringing hope into the places people are often afraid to discuss," Guerrero said. "Whether it's a veteran struggling with PTSD, a church leader battling lust or a family being torn apart by drugs or alcohol, we have to be willing to bring these struggles into the light. People need to know they don't have to fight alone."

At the emotional center is the plea, "Won't someone please come in and break this addiction." The lyrics capture the conflict of recognizing destructive behavior while being pulled back. The song turns toward Guerrero's Christian faith and an appeal to Jesus for freedom, healing and restoration. Guerrero hopes "Addiction" opens conversations about trauma, grief and loss beneath destructive behavior. It also addresses hidden struggles within Christian communities,

where leaders and congregants may privately battle lust, shame, depression, anxiety or isolation.

"The message is not condemnation," Guerrero said. "It is an invitation to stop hiding and pursue healing." He emphasizes that faith and professional care can work together, including counseling, medical care, recovery programs, accountability and supportive communities.

The release comes as the Trump administration's [Great American Recovery Initiative - The White House](#) brings national attention to prevention, treatment and recovery through collaboration among government, health care and faith communities. Guerrero hopes the song adds to that conversation by addressing trauma, isolation and hopelessness.

Guerrero's music and film career was already gaining momentum before he spent more than seven years overseas, including extended periods in Iraq, Afghanistan and elsewhere in the Middle East, much of it in high-threat environments. Years later, an ordinary machine buzzer reminded Guerrero of warning alarms he had heard overseas. The moment illustrated how sounds, environments and experiences can unexpectedly trigger people struggling with trauma-related conditions, whose effects are not always visible to others. Guerrero's years overseas gave him greater grace and compassion for those struggling with PTSD, addiction and trauma-related challenges, strengthening his desire to support people carrying invisible wounds.

"Some of the hardest battles are the ones nobody else can see," Guerrero said. "We have to become better at seeing people, listening to them and reminding each person that their life still has purpose and value."

Guerrero's career spans music, television, film and live performance. His work has generated more than 2 million cumulative streams and includes nationally charting releases, Top 5 Radio Play MPE recognition, FOX 2 Detroit and WXYZ-TV (ABC 7) appearances, One Tree Hill and international performances. Guerrero has toured and performed with numerous established artists, including David Allan Coe, who later invited him to sing on an unreleased song reflecting on Coe's life. Guerrero later officiated Coe's funeral.

Grammy-nominated and Dove Award-winning producer Dave Moody called Guerrero "one of the most gifted songwriters and creative musical artists I've had the pleasure of working with." "If this song reaches someone who believes nobody understands what they're fighting, I want them to hear one thing: Don't give up," Guerrero said. "Your struggle does not have to write the ending of your story. There is still hope. You are loved."

Guerrero is available for television, radio and podcast interviews, as well as acoustic and full-band performances.
