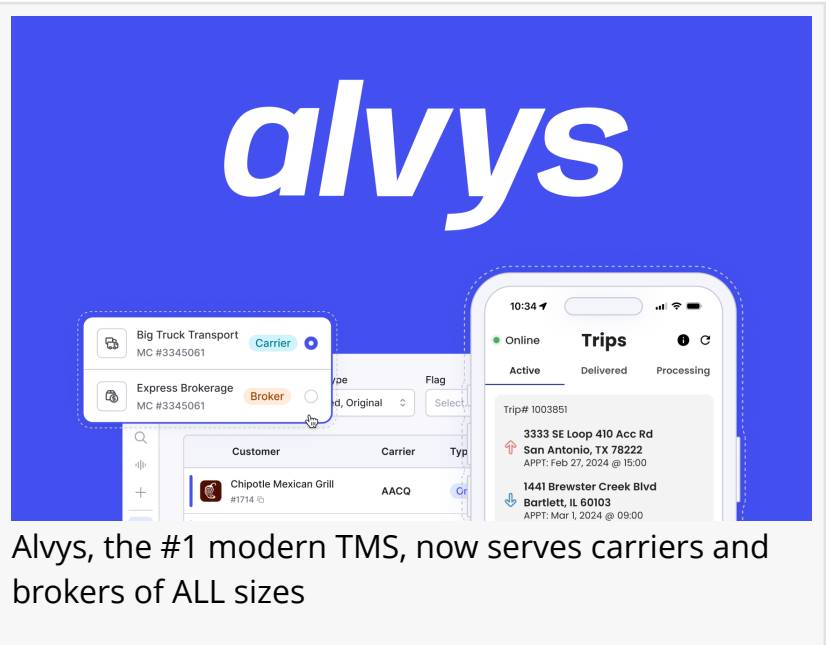


Alvys Launches Self-Serve Onboarding and Free Trial, Opening Its TMS to Trucking Companies of Any Size

Signing up takes about 10 minutes. A carrier enters its MC or DOT number and Alvys verifies it with the FMCSA on the spot, filling in company details automatically. The

verification step is deliberate: Alvys vets every MC to keep fraud out of the network. From there, the operator verifies their email with Google or Microsoft single sign-on, adds a payment

method, and lands on a Getting Started page where they can build their first load the same day.

From day one, new customers run dispatch, an AI tool that reads rate confirmations and creates loads in seconds, a driver mobile app with document scanning, same-day invoicing, and settlements on one platform. Alvys has 120 pre-build integrations including Quickbooks, major ELDs, load boards, fuel cards, and more.

The results carriers see on Alvys are documented. In a January 2026 survey of 208 Alvys customers, respondents reported getting paid 2 to 5 days faster on average, and 42% doubled their load volume without adding staff.

The self-serve motion reflects how Alvys sees its customers: not as small fleets, but as growing ones. Companies that start with one or two trucks run the same platform Alvys' largest fleets use, so there is no system to outgrow and no migration when they scale.
