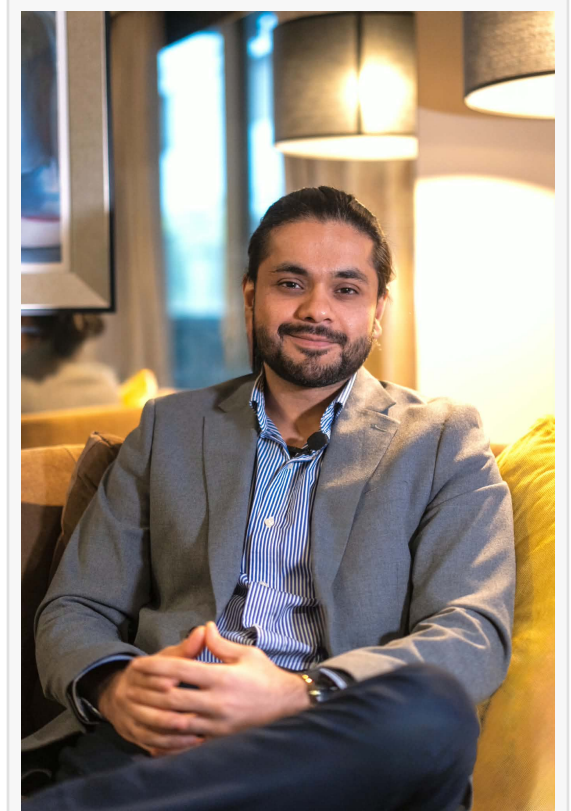


Citadel Compliance Founder Altamash Khan Reveals Business Ethos, Setting Out Why NDIS Compliance Needs a Clinical Voice

A Clinical Foundation That Changes the Compliance Conversation

Altamash Khan is a Registered Nurse with over half a decade of frontline clinical experience across regional Northern Territory, Victoria, and Western Australia, and a Doctor of Medicine final-year student at the University of Melbourne with a strong interest in the intersection between emerging technologies, including AI and robotics, and clinical practice. That dual background across bedside care and advanced clinical training is what prompted Khan to found Citadel Compliance, a Melbourne-based specialist consulting firm supporting Australian disability support services and aged care organisations in building clinical governance systems that are practical, operational, and built around how care is actually delivered.



Khan founded Citadel Compliance after three years of working closely with providers and observing a consistent pattern across the sector. A significant proportion of organisations are operating on templated, off-the-shelf documentation that may satisfy an audit on paper but does not reflect the reality of their care environment. In many cases, those systems pass regulatory scrutiny without meaningfully supporting frontline staff or improving the experience of the people in their care. Khan's view is that this represents a gap in the market rather than a failure of any individual provider. Many compliance consultants come from accounting or administrative backgrounds, but clinical governance, in his assessment, requires clinical judgement.

That judgement is what Altamash Khan built Citadel Compliance to provide.

What Good Compliance Systems Actually Demonstrate

Khan brings over half a decade of experience as a Registered Nurse across multiple healthcare settings in Australia, including regional Northern Territory, Victoria, and Western Australia. That frontline exposure shapes every framework Citadel Compliance builds. He understands what safe care delivery actually requires at the operational level, and designs governance systems that reflect it.



Khan's core philosophy is straightforward: well-written policies and procedures alone do not translate into improved outcomes unless they are embedded into day-to-day operations. When Citadel Compliance works with a provider, the objective is not simply audit readiness, but ensuring that governance systems genuinely reflect how care is delivered within that specific organisation — mapping real workflows, clarifying staff responsibilities, and producing documentation that frontline teams can actually use.

One of the more instructive observations Khan shares from his work concerns complaints management. Providers who receive no complaints sometimes assume that this reflects the quality of their care delivery. In Khan's experience, the absence of complaints more often indicates that the complaints management process itself is not accessible or understood by clients and families, rather than evidence that care is meeting the required standard.

Strong governance systems, in his view, are not defined by the absence of incidents, complaints, or risks. They are defined by how effectively those are identified, reported, and managed.

Building on What Providers Already Have

A central part of Khan's work involves helping providers assess what they already have in place

before building anything new. In many cases, organisations already have strong workforce capability and solid service delivery foundations. What they lack is a structure that presents those foundations in a way that aligns with regulatory expectations.

By refining and extending existing systems, providers can often expand into adjacent areas of healthcare, support a broader range of individuals, and grow their services sustainably without the disruption and cost of starting from scratch. Khan frames this as a matter of long-term sustainability and continuity of care, not simply compliance. Citadel Compliance supports providers with NDIS provider registration pathways, policy development, ISO-aligned quality and risk systems, internal audits, incident management, and DVA community nursing applications.

The Regulatory Moment That Makes This Work Urgent

From 1 July 2026, mandatory NDIS provider registration took effect for supported independent living and platform providers, a significant inflection point in the sector. Strengthened quality standards under the new Aged Care Act are placing growing demands on organisations of all sizes. Many providers, particularly smaller and mid-sized operators, are managing these pressures with limited internal resources and increasing external scrutiny.

For Citadel Compliance, these changes are not a starting point, but a validation of the approach Khan has been developing through three years of hands-on work with providers across the sector. The governance frameworks, audit preparation processes, and operational systems Citadel Compliance builds are grounded in that accumulated experience, and they are designed to hold up not just at the point of regulatory change, but in daily practice long after the deadline has passed.

Khan is also developing a compliance-focused software platform designed to support providers in capturing implementation evidence in real time rather than retrospectively preparing documentation ahead of audits. This initiative reflects his broader interest in how technology, including AI, can support safer and more efficient healthcare systems across the sector.
