Steven R. Johnson's Early Introduction to Knife Making

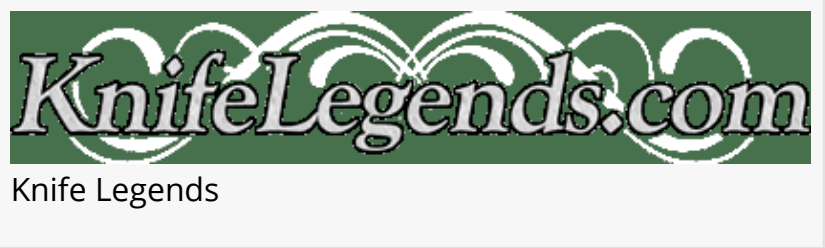
