the Ethics Officer for a company of more than 4,000 employees. Her professional experience includes environmental analysis, data validation, QA/QC programs, sustainable remediation, greenhouse gas verification, climate change education, water quality, watershed management, and environmental health and safety.

A respected author and speaker, Ann has contributed more than 250 technical publications, professional papers, and conference presentations addressing environmental science, analytical methods, laboratory ethics, and sustainability. She was also among the early professionals in her field to openly address ethics concerns within environmental laboratories, advocating for accountability, transparency, and integrity in scientific testing.

After decades of industry leadership, Ann transitioned into nonprofit leadership and community-based environmental education. Having lived and worked throughout the United States and Japan, she chose Smithville, Texas, as home to remain close to her family, including her daughter and grandson in Austin and her daughter and granddaughter in Bastrop.

Today, Ann serves as a Board Member and Development Officer for Keep Smithville Beautiful, where she supports sustainability initiatives, environmental education programs, and community engagement efforts. She also volunteers as a science and environmental educator with the Smithville ISD Afterschool Centers on Education (ACE) program, encouraging young students to explore science, consider STEM careers, and become future environmental leaders.

Ann attributes her success to her passion for her chosen field and her willingness to challenge expectations. Throughout her career, she has refused to allow stereotypes, traditions, or assumptions about women's roles to determine her opportunities. Instead, she pursued meaningful work, embraced challenges, and continued building expertise as a scientist and leader.

While her career journey included challenges, Ann credits the mentors, supervisors, and colleagues who supported her growth along the way. She also recognizes the influence of her family, which has a strong tradition of education and lifelong learning. Their encouragement allowed her to pursue her passion for science, celebrate achievements, learn from mistakes, and continue evolving throughout her career.

Today, Ann carries that same commitment into her community work by improving environmental education, increasing public engagement, and helping young people recognize their potential as scientists and environmental advocates.

One of the most important lessons Ann has learned throughout her career is the importance of verifying information and developing strong communication skills. She believes scientists must not only understand complex concepts but also communicate those ideas effectively to the public.

Ann emphasizes that written and verbal communication are essential skills for scientists, particularly when sharing research, educating communities, and building trust. As a mentor, she encourages students and professionals to practice writing, public speaking, and clear communication to expand their impact.

She also believes in the importance of collaboration and professional review. Ann recommends having scientific publications, presentations, and professional materials reviewed by trusted colleagues and experts to ensure accuracy, clarity, and appropriate messaging. She also emphasizes the importance of maintaining personal health and well-being while pursuing professional goals. Ann believes individuals must care for themselves by prioritizing healthy habits, managing stress, getting enough rest, exercising, and spending time outdoors whenever possible.

Ann encourages young professionals to explore their passions deeply through research, writing, collaboration, networking, and continuous learning. She believes volunteering, mentorship, professional development opportunities, and community involvement can create valuable experiences and open doors to unexpected opportunities.

The values that guide Ann's work and personal life include kindness, compassion, integrity, honesty, dependability, gratitude, and recognition. She believes meaningful leadership begins with treating others with respect and approaching challenges with empathy.

For Ann, integrity and honesty are essential foundations for building trust. She believes leaders should follow through on commitments and demonstrate reliability through their actions. She also believes gratitude and recognition have tremendous power, requiring little effort while making a meaningful difference in people's lives.

By acknowledging others' contributions and expressing appreciation, Ann believes leaders can create stronger relationships, more supportive communities, and environments where people feel valued.

Outside of her professional and volunteer commitments, Ann enjoys spending time with her children and grandchildren, especially her three-year-old granddaughter.
