

Harmony Painting Details Overnight Commercial Painting Work Behind Two Colorado Bar Rescue Episodes

Denver painting contractor explains how off-hours scheduling lets Colorado restaurants, hotels, and retail spaces renovate without closing their doors

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Harmony Painting, a [Denver-based commercial and residential painting contractor](#), completed overnight painting work for two Colorado episodes of the Paramount Network series Bar Rescue, delivering finished spaces inside the compressed production windows the show allows. The company was credited on air as a contractor on the renovation of G.I. Jodi's Bar and Grill in Littleton, Colorado.

Off-hours commercial painting refers to painting work scheduled during evenings, overnight hours, weekends, or seasonal closures so that a business can stay open and keep generating

revenue while its space is being refinished. It requires materials to be staged before crews arrive, work areas to be sequenced so each trade can finish before the next begins, and the space to be fully cleaned, dried, and returned to service before doors open.

Harmony Painting performed painting work on two Season 6 Bar Rescue renovations that aired in September 2019. The first was WildeFire Bistro in Aurora, featured in episode 45, "The Sound of Falling Music," which aired September 15, 2019. The second was G.I. Jodi's Bar and

Grill in Littleton, featured in episode 46, "Saving GI Jodi," which aired September 22, 2019, and

reopened as Malloy's. In the G.I. Jodi's episode, Harmony Painting was named among the local contractors credited for the renovation. Both projects required painting to be completed overnight, alongside electricians, carpenters, sign fabricators, and production crews working in the same space against a fixed filming schedule.

"Viewers see the excitement of the reveal, but they don't always see the planning and teamwork that make those transformations possible," said Spencer Melfi, owner of Harmony Painting. "Every trade has a role, and everyone depends on one another to stay on schedule. It's an environment where preparation and communication matter just as much as craftsmanship."

The economics that make television deadlines necessary apply to Colorado businesses year round. Colorado has more than 12,900 restaurant locations employing over 246,000 people, or nearly 10 percent of the state's labor force, and 69 percent of those restaurants are independently owned, according to the Colorado Restaurant Association. The association also reports that roughly three cents or less remains from each dollar spent at a restaurant after labor, overhead, and food costs. At those margins, closing a dining room for several days of daytime painting can erase weeks of profit, which is why hotels, restaurants, retail centers, healthcare facilities, and entertainment venues increasingly schedule refinishing work overnight or during off-peak hours.

Harmony Painting schedules this work using in-house crews rather than subcontractors, which the company says makes overnight staffing and quality control more predictable on tight timelines. The company provides [commercial painting for offices, retail centers](#), warehouses and industrial facilities, restaurants and hospitality venues, multifamily communities, and homeowner associations across Denver and the Front Range, and it has completed projects for venues including a golf course clubhouse in Littleton, a hotel exterior in Glenwood Springs, and entertainment centers in Thornton and Colorado Springs.

Harmony Painting is also an [EPA Lead-Safe Certified Firm](#), certification number NAT-F341962-1, which is required for renovation and painting work that disturbs paint in commercial and residential buildings constructed before 1978. Many of the older commercial buildings along Denver's established corridors fall into that category.
