Abstract Submissions Open Through October 1

The [abstract submission portal](#) is open through October 1, 2026, at 17:00 CDT. Abstracts received by the deadline will be reviewed by the WORLDSymposium Scientific Committee for potential

platform or poster presentation. Notifications will be issued by November 2, 2026.

A separate Late-Breaking Abstract category will be available November 1–December 1, 2026, for investigators with new and impactful data that was not available by the primary submission deadline.
