

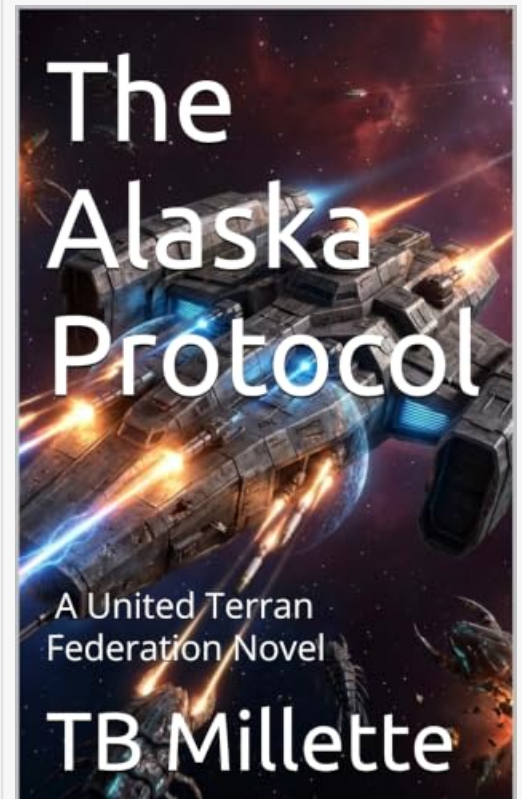
The Alaska Protocol Sends Humanity Into a High Stakes Battle for Survival Among the Stars

TB Millette launches a layered science fiction saga where command, sacrifice, and an alien threat force one leader to confront the legacy he cannot escape.

NEW YORK CITY, NY, UNITED STATES, August 14, 2026 /EINPresswire.com/ -- TB Millette launches the United Terran Federation series with *The Alaska Protocol*, a science fiction novel combining interstellar warfare, advanced technology, survival, and the psychological demands of leadership. Commander Ragnar Chamberlain takes command of the U.S.S. Alaska, the Federation's most advanced escort starship, while carrying the burden of his father's past failure. Rather than viewing command as an achievement, Ragnar sees an unforgiving equation in which every decision could determine whether his crew survives. His leadership is tested almost immediately when an unfamiliar and predatory civilization emerges as a threat.

The U.S.S. Alaska stands at the technological center of *The Alaska Protocol*, powered by a zero-point core and operated by a crew that has not yet developed complete confidence in its new commander. Before Ragnar can finish putting the ship and its personnel through their initial trials, the Kentrax arrive. Their intentions extend beyond conventional conquest, creating a confrontation with an enemy whose motivations and methods challenge human expectations. The conflict carries Ragnar and his crew from the controlled environment of the Alaska's bridge into the terrifying confines of a biological hive world, where familiar assumptions about combat no longer apply.

Millette uses Ragnar's command to explore one of the novel's central questions: What happens when leadership ultimately leaves one person responsible for an impossible decision? In *The Alaska Protocol*, Ragnar's greatest conflict is not limited to the Kentrax. He has spent his life haunted by the consequences of his father's choices and fears being forced into the same circumstances. As danger intensifies, Ragnar confronts the prospect of sacrificing a small

number of people to preserve many more. His challenge becomes finding whether another path exists when duty, survival, and personal history collide.

Designed for readers who enjoy immersive science fiction, military command narratives, alien civilizations, and stories with psychological depth, *The Alaska Protocol* places leadership alongside its larger interstellar spectacle. Gravity becomes a weapon, hostile creatures threaten the ship's corridors, and an advanced vessel is pushed into situations its crew could scarcely anticipate. Beneath that action is Millette's interest in what leadership means when there is no one else available to make the decision. The novel examines responsibility under pressure and the emotional consequences carried by those expected to remain composed while others depend upon them. TB Millette developed *The Alaska Protocol* from a longstanding enjoyment of reading and a desire to create stories that other science fiction enthusiasts could experience for themselves. The novel introduces a larger imaginative universe that Millette intends to continue exploring, beginning with *Ragnar*, the *Alaska*, and the emerging struggle confronting the United Terran Federation. By combining large-scale science fiction with questions of duty, sacrifice, inherited fear, and command, *The Alaska Protocol* establishes a story in which humanity's survival may depend not simply on superior technology, but on the choices made when leadership has nowhere left to hide.
