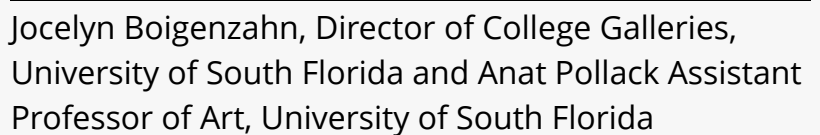


The jurors will review hundreds of applications, evaluating artistic excellence, originality, and technical merit to determine which artists will be invited to exhibit at the 2027 festival at

Noah Cox is an assistant curator at the Museum of Fine Arts, St. Petersburg, and a curator of the upcoming Skyway regional triennial. A Florida native, Cox holds a master's degree from the Courtauld Institute of Art in London.

Ola Wlusek is curator of modern and contemporary art at The John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art and a faculty member at Florida State University. She is also a co-curator of the upcoming Skyway triennial.

Jocelyn Boigenzahn is director of College Galleries at the University of Tampa, where she oversees the Scarfone/Hartley Gallery and works to connect university exhibitions and collections with the broader community.

Anat Pollack is an assistant professor of art at the University of South Florida and a practicing artist whose work combines traditional processes with digital technologies. Her work has been exhibited nationally and throughout Tampa Bay.
