Thompson, MBA, has built a distinguished career defined by military leadership, operational excellence, strategic thinking, and an unwavering commitment to developing others. With nearly 22 years of active-duty service as a U.S. Army Intelligence Officer, she has led high-performing teams across strategic operations, organizational transformation, intelligence, crisis response, and global missions.



In her last active-duty assignment as Battalion Commander for the Mission Support Battalion under the United States Army Recruiting Command, Lyndsey oversaw national marketing and outreach operations supporting Army recruiting efforts. She developed training and onboarding systems, conducted compliance investigations as an Inspector General, and commanded organizations responsible for intelligence, logistics, and administrative support. These experiences helped shape her understanding that successful leadership requires more than technical competence. It requires communication, accountability, emotional intelligence, adaptability, and the ability to develop people.

Lyndsey earned her Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Western Kentucky University and later completed an MBA with a concentration in Marketing from the University of Louisville. Her professional education also includes advanced military training through the Joint Forces Staff College and the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

As she prepares to transition from military service into the private sector, Lyndsey is bringing her extensive leadership experience to a new generation of professionals. Through Thompson LDRShip Enterprises, LLC, she focuses on helping Generation Z and early-career professionals develop the communication, leadership, mentorship, and strategic thinking skills necessary to navigate today's rapidly changing workforce.

Lyndsey credits their example and support, along with her faith, with giving her the foundation that has shaped her career.

One of the most important lessons she has carried throughout her professional journey is to find something to love in every position and give it her all. She recognizes that a military career can involve numerous assignments and transitions, and service members may not always have a significant say in what position comes next.

Rather than becoming discouraged when a particular assignment is not an ideal fit, Lyndsey believes individuals should identify something within the role that genuinely resonates with them. Finding an aspect of the work that they enjoy can help them take ownership, remain

engaged, and perform at their highest level.

Her philosophy is simple: whenever possible, find something to love in everything you do. If someone cannot identify anything meaningful or fulfilling in their work, she believes it may be time to consider a different direction.

Mentorship is central to Lyndsey's approach to leadership and is one of the key themes of *Mentor Me: Leadership Handbook for Gen Z*. She strongly encourages emerging professionals, young women specifically, to identify people who are already doing what they aspire to do and learn directly from them.

Her advice is to find a mentor, ask questions, listen to feedback, implement recommendations, and then return to the mentor with feedback about what happened. In her view, mentorship should be an active relationship rather than simply a title or connection.

Lyndsey also emphasizes leadership development. Young professionals should deliberately invest in themselves by learning how to lead, communicate, collaborate, and influence others. She believes ideas are only as impactful as an individual's ability to communicate them clearly to another person.

Emotional intelligence is another essential component of her philosophy. She encourages emerging leaders to understand their emotional vulnerabilities, recognize their challenges, and develop greater self-awareness. Combined with mentorship and leadership development, this awareness can help young professionals become more effective and resilient leaders.

Lyndsey also stresses the importance of gaining real-world experience. She encourages young women to actively search for opportunities to sharpen their skills and build portfolios that provide tangible evidence of what they can accomplish. Experience, she believes, can help distinguish a candidate from others who may possess academic credentials but have limited opportunities to demonstrate their abilities.

Military service has also taught Lyndsey to view challenges differently. As an Army officer, she has experienced periods of demanding operational tempo, changing global circumstances, and assignments that can require separation from family and friends. Isolation and pressure can become significant challenges, particularly during periods of conflict or intense operational activity.

Yet Lyndsey believes challenges can become opportunities for growth. Difficult assignments can sharpen skills, strengthen resilience, and develop the endurance and stamina needed to succeed over the long term. Rather than viewing obstacles solely as setbacks, she encourages people to ask what the experience can teach them and how it can make them better.

This perspective is deeply connected to the values that guide her life. Lyndsey lives by the Army

values of loyalty, duty, respect, selfless service, honor, integrity, and personal courage. These principles have shaped her approach to leadership, decision-making, teamwork, and service throughout her military career.

She also places faith and family at the forefront of her values. Together, these principles form the foundation of how she approaches her professional responsibilities and personal life.

As Lyndsey prepares for the next chapter of her career, her focus remains firmly on service—this time through mentorship, authorship, consulting, and leadership development. Her goal is not simply to share what she has learned throughout nearly two decades of military service, but to help young professionals develop the confidence and capabilities to build meaningful careers of their own.
