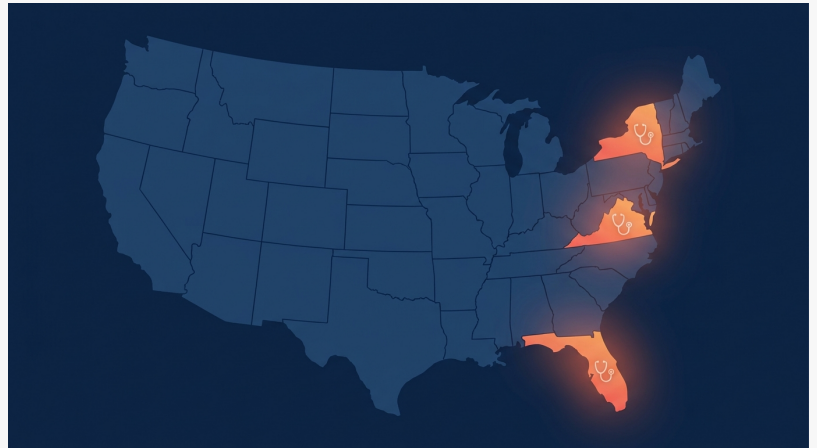


New York Pet Parents Pay Up to 20% More Than Florida and Virginia for Routine Vet Care, RexVet 2026 Cost Review Finds

Non-profit RexVet reviewed published 2025-2026 vet pricing across its three licensed states and released free cost guides on spay/neuter, vaccines and exams.

MIAMI, FL, UNITED STATES, August 20, 2026 /EINPresswire.com/ -- Routine veterinary care costs pet parents in New York roughly 20% more than it costs their counterparts in Florida and Virginia, according to a review of published 2025-2026 pricing data released this week by RexVet (Rex Vets Inc.), the 501(c)(3) non-profit veterinary telehealth service licensed in all three states.



RexVet is licensed in Florida, New York, and Virginia.

Drawing on the 2025 Synchrony/CareCredit veterinary cost study, 2025-2026 consumer pricing guides from Rover and Chewy, and live retail vaccine-clinic price lists, RexVet's guides find:

- Spay/neuter: the average dog spay runs about \$448 in Florida and \$441 in Virginia - but \$538 in New York. Dog neuters average \$479 (FL), \$473 (VA) and \$575 (NY), against a \$487 national average (2025 Synchrony/CareCredit study).

- Exam fees: the average dog exam is about \$45 in Florida, \$71 in Virginia and \$72 in New York - charged on top of any vaccine or procedure at most private practices (Rover, 2025).

- Vaccines: most individual dog vaccines run \$15-\$100, and a puppy's complete first-year series

typically costs \$100-\$300 or more before exam fees. Even at retail vaccine clinics, the same rabies shot lists at \$39 in Orlando, \$41 in Richmond and \$45 in Manhattan.

"Pet parents tell us they feel the cost of care before they feel anything else - and the same surgery can cost a Brooklyn family a hundred dollars more than a family in Tampa or Richmond," said Dr. Tiffany Delacruz, DVM, CEO of RexVet. "As a non-profit, our job is to make the numbers transparent, point families to legitimate low-cost programs in their county, and keep our own price flat: a \$64.99 video visit, whether you're in Florida, New York or Virginia."

The guides also catalog verified low-cost options in each state - including county spay/neuter programs in Miami-Dade and Hillsborough, the ASPCA's free and \$125 surgeries for qualifying New York City residents, and Fairfax County's \$20 rabies clinics - while noting that eligibility and availability change and should be confirmed directly.
