

The Unfiltered Chapters of Divorce Examines Family Breakdown, Fatherhood, and a Fight for Court Reform

Corey Stevens recounts divorce, custody conflict, career loss, and personal recovery while questioning how family courts handle allegations and parental rights.

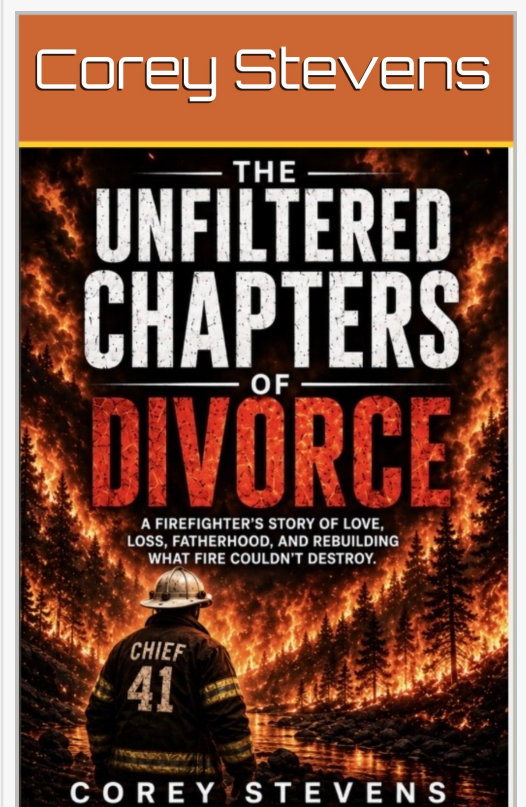

Stevens recounts events from his own perspective while advancing a broader argument for family court reform, particularly regarding the weight given to allegations before they have been fully examined against available evidence.

The Unfiltered Chapters of Divorce follows Stevens through the upheaval that came after his marriage unraveled, including temporary living arrangements, limited time with his three daughters, an unsuccessful attempt at reconciliation, and increasingly complicated personal and legal conflicts. The narrative also reaches backward to his military years and the beginning of his marriage, providing context for the family life that preceded the divorce.

Against that history, Stevens describes how a series of court orders, law enforcement encounters, and custody disputes transformed a private separation into a conflict with consequences extending far beyond his former relationship.

Stevens also writes about the personal toll of navigating these events while working in a profession built around responding to other people's emergencies. His account includes depression, drinking, damaged relationships, and the eventual loss of his Fire Chief position. Yet *The Unfiltered Chapters of Divorce* is not focused solely on conflict; it also explores fatherhood,

his daughters' resilience, a new relationship, and the birth of another daughter, offering a counterpoint to the legal and emotional turmoil as he rebuilds his life while unresolved challenges remain.

The book's central public issue is Stevens's call for greater scrutiny of how allegations are handled in family court. Drawing from his own experiences and interpretation of the events surrounding his case, he argues that unverified claims can have serious consequences for parents and children before the facts are fully established. Stevens does not frame the concern as exclusive to fathers, maintaining that both mothers and fathers can be harmed by a system that fails to distinguish adequately between accusation and evidence.

Corey Stevens is a former Fire Chief, firefighter, military veteran, and father whose experiences form the foundation of *The Unfiltered Chapters of Divorce*. Now living in South Carolina, he uses his story to examine the collision between private family conflict and institutions capable of reshaping a person's parental, professional, and personal life. By documenting both his own mistakes and the actions he believes were unjust, Stevens presents an intentionally unfiltered account centered on accountability, fatherhood, recovery, and his conviction that meaningful family court reform deserves greater public discussion.
