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mobility, and cross-border employment strategies. The new book translates lessons from that experience into practical guidance for readers who may be encountering the American employment system for the first time.

“International job seekers are often trying to solve two complicated problems at once,” Hashmi said. “They must persuade an employer that they are the right person for the job while also understanding whether and how they may lawfully work in the United States. Those questions cannot always be separated.”



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The book explains how readers can:

- Develop a realistic U.S. career strategy;
- Identify and communicate the value of their education and international experience;
- Adapt their résumés and professional profiles for American employers;
- Prepare effectively for interviews and networking opportunities;
- Make productive use of career counseling;
- Understand fundamental work-visa and employment-authorization concepts; and
- Continue investing in their professional development after obtaining a position.

The book does not promise shortcuts or guaranteed results. Instead, it emphasizes preparation, informed decision-making, and realistic expectations. Hashmi also

discusses how immigration planning can intersect with an employer’s business needs, hiring timetable, compliance obligations, and long-term workforce strategy.

“Whether someone is entering the workforce, changing careers, or pursuing a long-term professional goal, preparation creates options,” Hashmi said. “A strong application must present both the applicant’s professional value and a credible path for the employer to hire that person.”

Hashmi uses personal anecdotes throughout the book to challenge conventional assumptions

about career success. In one story, he recalls buying lunch from a hot-dog vendor on Connecticut Avenue while beginning his professional career in Washington, D.C., during the mid-1990s. The vendor had borrowed \$10,000 from his father after high school and built a profitable independent business, while Hashmi was beginning a more conventional career after years of college and law school. "Maybe the hot-dog cart was the smarter career move," Hashmi writes.

The story illustrates one of the book's broader themes: no single career path is right for everyone. Newcomers should consider their abilities, resources, immigration circumstances, tolerance for risk, and personal goals rather than simply following the choices made by others.

Hired in America! is organized as a practical reference rather than a book that must be read from beginning to end. Readers will be able to consult individual chapters according to their immediate needs, whether they are selecting a career direction, preparing application materials, approaching employers, interviewing for positions, or considering employment-related immigration options.
