As part of this year's AI Governance World conference, Kiteworks' General Counsel Camilo Artiga-Purcell will present, "Your AI Passed the Bar Exam. Your Governance Didn't," detailing the legal exposure organizations face once AI touches privileged data. Chief Strategy Officer Tim Freestone will present "Controlling Data Access and Use by AI Agents for Compliant AI," on why governing data in motion, not just data at rest, is essential to closing that exposure. Freestone stated, "Governing data at rest is no longer enough. Organizations must extend the same rigor to data in motion, the point where AI agents request, use, and share information, because that is where the real risk lives."

Both sessions draw on Kiteworks' newly released 2026 Data Security and Compliance Risk Report, which found the average organization has only about a third of the AI data governance controls in place needed to meaningfully reduce risk, even as AI agents gain broader, more autonomous access to that data every day.

At the conference, Kiteworks will highlight the growing need for organizations to establish comprehensive governance over sensitive data as AI systems and autonomous AI agents gain broader access to enterprise information.
