

Nevada Guardian Services Releases Free Attorney Resource Kit on Nevada Guardianship

LAS VEGAS, NV, UNITED STATES, August 28, 2026 /EINPresswire.com/ -- Nevada Guardian Services, LLC has published a free [Attorney Resource Kit](#) for estate planning, elder law, and probate attorneys who evaluate whether a client needs a [professional guardian or fiduciary in Nevada](#). The materials are available without registration on the agency's resources page.

The kit contains six documents: an agency overview, a set of frequently asked questions written for attorneys, a summary of National Guardianship Association Standards 5, 9, and 10, an overview of the Protected Person's Bill of Rights, a quick reference guide for guardianship referrals, and a collection of case studies in professional guardianship.

The referral guide addresses the question attorneys most often face at intake: whether a situation calls for full guardianship or whether a less restrictive arrangement will protect the client adequately. Nevada courts require that guardianship be considered only after less restrictive alternatives have been examined, and options such as a Power of Attorney, a representative payee, or supported decision-making may allow a person to retain more independence.

"Attorneys are usually the first professional in the room when a family realizes something has to change, and they are making a referral decision with incomplete information," said Susan M. Hoy, president, chief executive officer, and founder of Nevada Guardian Services. "This kit exists so that decision takes ten minutes instead of three phone calls."

The Protected Person's Bill of Rights overview addresses a point that is frequently misunderstood by families entering the process. An adult under guardianship retains every right the court has not specifically limited, and guardianship is intended to restrict rights as narrowly as the circumstances require. The document summarizes those retained rights in plain language

The National Guardianship Association standards summary covers three areas central to how a professional guardian should operate: standards governing the guardian's relationship with the protected person, decision-making practices, and the guardian's duty to seek the least restrictive alternative. Nevada Guardian Services operates as a nationally certified guardian agency and follows those standards in each case it accepts.

Nevada guardianship is court-supervised under NRS Chapter 159. Guardians file care plans, status reports, and

financial accountings for court review, and professional guardians are compensated only after a court approves a fee petition documenting time spent and benefit to the protected person. The case studies in the kit illustrate how that oversight functions in practice, including matters involving cognitive decline, family conflict, and situations where no suitable family member is available to serve.

Nevada Guardian Services does not provide legal advice, and the kit directs attorneys and families to licensed counsel for interpretation of Nevada guardianship law. The agency serves as court-appointed guardian, neutral third-party agent under Power of Attorney, probate administrator, and trustee, including administration of Special Needs Trusts.
