

Global Vikas Trust Dedicates Railway Police Facility at Borivali Station on Hiten Bhuta's 55th Birthday

The July 23 program provided 38 lockers, computers and workplace furniture to support Railway Police personnel at Borivali Station.

MUMBAI, MAHARASHTRA, INDIA, August 27, 2026 /EINPresswire.com/ -- Global Vikas Trust is highlighting a public-service program held at Borivali Railway Police Station on July 23, 2026, at 10:30 a.m., when the Trust inaugurated and dedicated a workplace facility for Railway Police personnel on the occasion of the 55th birthday of U.S.-based Hiten Bhuta.

The program focused on practical support for Railway Police personnel serving commuters and carrying out day-to-day responsibilities at one of Mumbai's important railway locations. As part of the initiative, a facility consisting of 38 lockers, computers, tables, chairs and other furniture was formally inaugurated and handed over to the Railway Police for their use.

The program brought together Railway Police officials, other police personnel, representatives of Global Vikas Trust and members of the [Kapol community](#). The gathering centered on the formal inauguration and handover of the facility and recognition of continued community participation in supporting public-service institutions.

Representing Global Vikas Trust and the Kapol community were Gopalbhai Parekh, a senior member and community worker and Honorary Editor of Kapol-Kapol Mitra; Kapilbhai Mehta, Trustee of Global Vikas Trust; Niranjanbhai Sheth, Project Director for the Saurashtra Division of Global Vikas Trust; and Mukeshbhai Mehta, Project Director of Global Vikas Trust and a friend of the Police.

By dedicating resources intended for routine workplace use, the program connected community service with the practical requirements of frontline public-service personnel. The facility is intended to give Railway Police personnel additional infrastructure for organizing their workplace and carrying out everyday administrative and operational responsibilities.

This continuing approach reflects a simple public-service principle: community participation can

The initiative was organized on the occasion of Hiten Bhuta's 55th birthday, giving the milestone a public-service focus. Rather than centering the occasion only on a personal celebration, the program linked it with a tangible contribution for personnel serving citizens through the railway policing system.

The Borivali program also continues a broader pattern of railway-police support undertaken through similar social-service initiatives. Global Vikas Trust has previously dedicated Help Desks for Railway Police personnel at

be most meaningful when it responds to an identifiable need and leaves behind something useful for the people performing everyday public responsibilities.

The July 23 program therefore combined three elements: recognition of a personal milestone, participation by members of the Kapol community, and a practical contribution to the Railway Police. The presence of senior police personnel and community representatives also provided an opportunity to strengthen communication between those working in public-service environments and citizens seeking constructive ways to contribute.

A video titled Borivali Railway Police Station Public-Service Initiative documents the program and provides an additional record of the facility dedication.

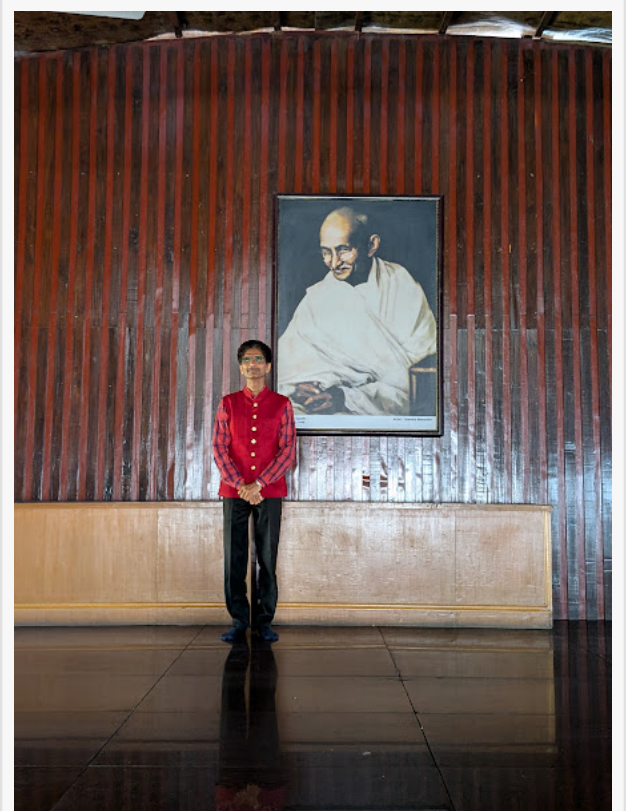
Global Vikas Trust said the initiative reflects its continued commitment to public service, community welfare and support for Railway Police personnel. Its previous Help Desk initiatives at railway stations provide continuity to the Borivali program and demonstrate an emphasis on practical community-service projects.

In addition to the physical public-service facility initiative, the program also highlighted a technology-based public-service concept developed by CGS Infotech Solutions: Mumbai Police CaseSaarthi AI.

Designed as a special “Case-Diary GPT” concept for police workflow assistance, Mumbai Police CaseSaarthi AI aims to support officers in organizing case diaries, daily investigation updates, pending actions and legal references in a more structured manner. The initiative explores how artificial intelligence tools can assist police personnel with documentation and information management while keeping professional judgment, verification and decision-making with trained officers.

The AI assistant has been developed as a public-service technology initiative by CGS Infotech Solutions. Police officials are invited to test the concept and share suggestions, improvements and expectations so that the system can be refined according to practical departmental requirements.

The development of Mumbai Police CaseSaarthi AI received guidance and support from Senior Police Officer Shri Sachin Sawant and Police Mitra Shri Mukesh Mehta. The initiative represents an effort to explore responsible technology adoption for public-service environments by

connecting practical police requirements with emerging AI capabilities.
