According to Patent Attorney, for an inventor the path from an early concept to an issued patent can be difficult to see in full. A promising idea may begin on a whiteboard, in a laboratory or during the development of a new product. What follows can involve technical documentation, prior art research, carefully written claims and an extended review process before the United States Patent and Trademark Office. The redesigned website arranges those stages into a five-step framework, making it easier for visitors to identify where they are in the process and what may come next.

"Our new website was built with one goal in mind: making it simpler for inventors and businesses, including the growing number of innovators we work with in Virginia, to understand their options and get in front of the right attorney quickly," says a spokesperson for Patent Attorney.

Through the website, visitors can now move between five principal areas of service: filing a patent application, obtaining a patent search or opinion, responding to the USPTO, pursuing litigation and PTAB proceedings, and exploring options to sell or license a patent.

This structure reflects the different decisions that may arise throughout the life of an invention. Before filing, an inventor may need to determine whether similar technology already exists. During examination, the USPTO may issue an office action that requires legal arguments, amendments or clarification. Once a patent has been secured, the owner may consider licensing the technology, transferring ownership or enforcing the patent in a dispute.

The expanded site also addresses the technical settings in which patent questions occur. Its industry resources cover electrical and computer technology, energy and chemicals, life sciences, transportation, aerospace and defense. More specific subject areas include artificial intelligence, financial technology, telecommunications, biotechnology, medical devices, pharmaceuticals, cleantech, manufacturing and autonomous vehicles.

These resources may be particularly relevant to Virginia businesses operating within the broader Washington, D.C., metropolitan innovation corridor. Technology companies, research ventures and other organizations in the region often develop products that call for an understanding of both the underlying science and the legal standards governing patent protection.

Patent Attorney's practitioners bring legal training and technical backgrounds to that work.
