CAETA and a member of the California Veterinary Medical Association. That combination of veterinary training, counseling education, and specialized end-of-life certification is rare, and it shapes every visit she makes.

Dr. Glatting grew up in Phoenix and now calls San Diego home, a city she has chosen and built her life in. Serving the families of this community carries particular meaning for her because of that personal investment. She understands that losing a pet is rarely a simple grief. Families are not only saying goodbye to a beloved companion. They are often losing familiar routines, a source of daily comfort, and a part of how they understand themselves and their home. "I provide in-home euthanasia because I want families to have the time, privacy, and support to honor that bond in a familiar setting," she says. "I hope to help create a peaceful goodbye that reflects the significance of the life and relationship being remembered."

Her commitment to this work is also personal. Dr. Glatting carries the memory of Harvest, her beloved cat who is no longer physically with her but remains, as she describes it, an important part of her family. Saying goodbye to Harvest deepened her understanding of how profound that loss can be and how meaningful it is to honor the bond that remains. That lived experience with both loss and love is what she brings to every home she enters. "Euthanasia should be approached with grace, dignity, and respect," she says. "It is not only a peaceful goodbye, but also an honoring of the life and love shared between a pet and their family."

How In-home Pet Euthanasia Works

Through CodaPet, pet parents can easily book in-home pet euthanasia performed by a compassionate and licensed veterinarian. Prior to the appointment, the veterinarian contacts the family to address any questions or concerns they might have. At the appointment, the veterinarian assists the family by going over the diagnosis and applying a quality-of-life assessment to objectively assess the pet's health and ensure there is no uncertainty about the need for euthanasia.

The visit takes, on average, 45 minutes. Pet parents have a window of time to be with their pets privately before and after the euthanasia procedure. The veterinarian only starts the euthanasia process when everyone is ready. This helps bring closure to all family members involved in the end-of-life care of a pet. For those who need support with aftercare, the veterinarian can assist with transportation and cremation services.

Benefits of In-home Pet Euthanasia include:
