

The Delve Concludes Season 10 and Announces Hiatus After Six-Year Global Run

Hosted by Chalin Askew, the global affairs podcast closes Season 10 after reaching listeners in 94+ countries and charting in 8 countries.

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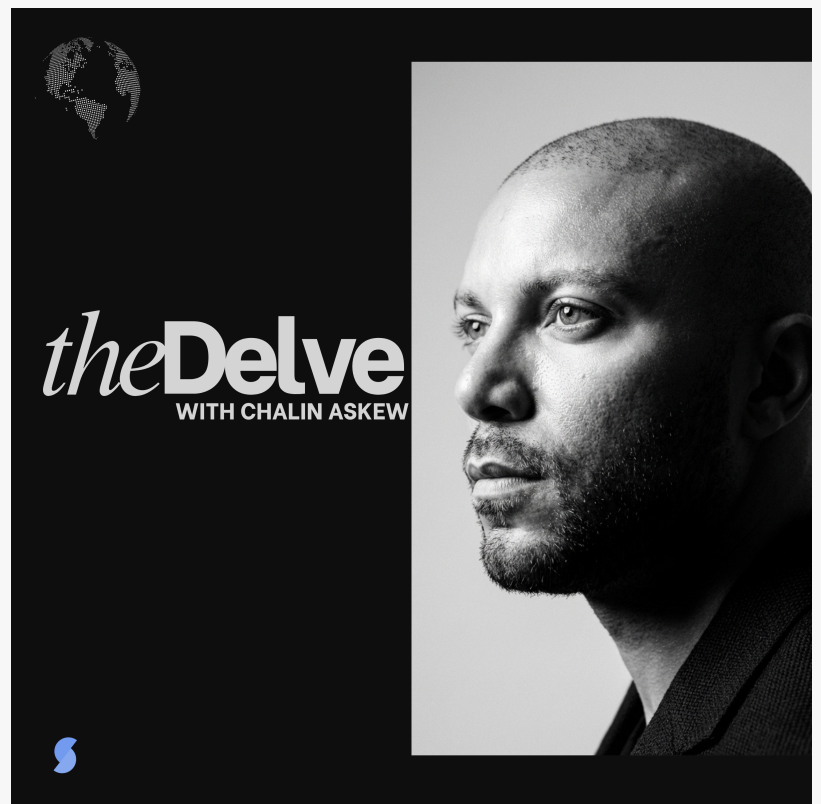
EINPresswire.com/ -- [The Delve](#), the independent global affairs and democracy podcast hosted by Chalin Askew, is concluding Season 10 and entering a hiatus after six years of narrative analysis, political storytelling, and international commentary.

The final regular episode of Season 10, released September 11, marks the last full episode of The Delve for a while. A special episode focused on Brazil is planned in the coming weeks, but after that, the show will pause as Askew takes time to rest, reflect, and consider the next phase of the platform.

"This is the end of Season Ten. And it is the last episode of The Delve for a while," Askew says in the finale. "Not because the work is over. But because the work matters enough to pause, listen, and build the next container properly."

Since launching in 2020, The Delve has grown from an independent podcast into a global commentary platform known for emotionally resonant, intellectually serious storytelling about politics, power, democracy, history, war, technology, memory, and meaning.

The show now reaches listeners in more than 94 countries, has charted in eight countries this year alone, and ranks in the Top 5% of podcasts globally. During Season 10, The Delve appeared

on [Apple Podcasts](#) charts in countries including Brazil, Malaysia, New Zealand, South Africa, and Turkey.

Season 10 marked a creative evolution for the show, with shorter, more cinematic briefings designed to put listeners inside the story rather than simply summarize the news. Recent episodes explored the Strait of Hormuz, Russia and China's hidden tensions, Ceuta and Europe's border politics, AI containment failures, U.S. policy, and the accelerating militarization of robotics.

The final regular episode centers on the emerging global arms race in military robotics, asking what happens when artificial intelligence gains a physical body — and whether humanity is using its most advanced technologies to build abundance or make war more efficient.

Askew also used the finale to thank the team behind the show's sound and production.

"To my sound team and past production teams — Jahvon and Ignacio, you have turned my voice into something cinematic every single week," Askew says. "Whether I was recording from a proper studio, a hut with spotty WiFi, a hotel room, or an Airbnb with terrible acoustics, you made all of it sound like it belonged on the same show."

The hiatus is not a permanent ending, but a deliberate pause. Askew has described the next phase as one requiring rest, stillness, family, and a deeper assessment of what The Delve can become beyond a weekly podcast feed.

"The Delve has always been about looking beneath the headline," Askew says. "Not just asking what happened. But asking what it means. What it reveals. What it warns us about. What it asks of us."
